Below you will find a list of the religious holy days that may impact your calendars during the **2024-2025 academic year**. Please keep in mind this is not an exhaustive list. The holidays included are those that may have a significant impact on observant students and could present a conflict with academic requirements. This list is more extensive than in years past to reflect our changing demographics as a college, but not all holidays will apply to all students.

Please avoid scheduling programs, fieldtrips, events, exams, or major projects on these days, as some members of our community could be fasting, limiting work, or observing the holiday in other ways. *Some religious observances require additional time for preparation or travel before and after the actual holy day.*

We are in the process of updating our current **Religious Observance Procedure (formerly the Religious Accommodation Procedure)** so please look out for those communications. For academic conflicts, students will be instructed to request a change in required assignments or attendance, which the Chaplain must approve before it is submitted for final approval from the impacted faculty member(s) and the Associate Provost for Undergraduate Studies.

IMPORTANT RELIGIOUS HOLY DAYS: August 2024 – July 2025

**Note: For most religious traditions, the celebration or observance begins the evening before the actual day (sometimes called “eve” or “erev”). In these circumstances, both days are listed for ease of reference. Work restrictions for Jewish holidays begin shortly before sundown on the first date indicated.*

Some holidays in Islam are not fixed to a calendar but based on the actual sighting of the moon and therefore there may be some variance by day.

NOTE: Unless indicated, work is not restricted on these days but attendance at services, fasting, or other observances may take place.
